Quilt Show News / Charity Highlights



Laurie Shaw working with Patti Jones and Ester Mayo – Were able to gather charity quilts to be hung as we have done previously in the Church – The following was received from Laurie including what was posted along with the quilts for the congregation - "We hung 26 quilts this week and wow oh wow do they brighten and cheer the hallways at the church!!!"

Gate City Quilt Guild, about 70 members strong, make quilts year-round that we then donate to several charitable organizations. Most of the 100+ quilts each year go to Cone Health for the Neo Natal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) and the Sexual Abuse Nurse Examiners (SANE) for the patients they work with. We also provide quilts to Mustard Seed Community Health to comfort families receiving medical attention from this amazing group of medical professionals.

The quilts come in all sizes and colors and fabrics. Much of the fabric is donated by members or friends of the Guild. We also use funds from our Quilt Show to supply quilt batting and thread. Show and Tell during our monthly meetings are filled with quilt after quilt made with love and given away with even more love.

Please enjoy the exhibit. All of these quilts will be donated by the end of the year.

November 4th Guild Meeting - Elizabeth DeCroos, "Pojagi: Korean Quilting" - Meeting to be held via Zoom



Elizabeth started sewing as a child and has always been interested in a variety of needlecrafts. In 2009, she took her young family to South Korea, where she had the opportunity to learn pojagi – a traditional Korean art form that goes back thousands of years.

Pojagi is characterized by translucent fabrics and reversible patchwork that glows in the sun like stained glass.

Upon returning to Canada, Elizabeth developed techniques for similar patchwork using a sewing machine and materials more readily available.

She continues to design with the technique in her home base – Epida Studio. Her pattern line is called Epida Designs and she publishes modern pojagi patterns as well as traditional pojagi and regular western quilting patterns. She also teaches



sewing, quilting and embroidery at in person workshops and through online courses and tutorials at her website <u>www.epidastudio.com</u>.
