

Linda Bryant - was introduced to quilting at a very young age when she could handle scissors and a pencil to cut quilt pieces from sandpaper templates made by her grandmother. Over the years she became an accomplished seamstress and master of other handcrafts including knitting, crocheting, cross stitch and needlepoint.

Linda has studied extensively with Jinny Beyer and several other nationally recognized teachers in the quilting world. Upon retiring in 2003 from Verizon Communications, she began teaching quilt classes at G Street Fabrics in the Washington, DC area.

Since moving to North Carolina in the summer of 2006 to be closer to her

grown children, Linda and her husband have been able to enjoy the easygoing lifestyle of retirees. Many of her quilts have already won ribbons in North Carolina including Judge's Choice for her rendition of Jinny Beyer's Moon Glow, Judge's Choice for "Fruit Salad", her interpretation of Aquamarine Ambiance by Jenny and Simon Haskins, and a blue ribbon for her batik quilted jacket and her first miniature quilt, Diamonds in the Rough. More recently she has won ribbons at the Asheville Quilt Show and currently has a quilt on tour with the 2022 Quilters Treasure Challenge.

Linda continues her goal of teaching at several local quilt shops, teaching workshops and presenting trunk shows squeezed in between taking care of two of her three grandchildren with her husband John, also known as Featherweight Poppy
