Because of health issues our previously listed speaker will not be able to present her program on August 3rd. But our own **Beverly Roesink** will talk to us about cleaning and maintaining our machines. She will demonstrate with a Pfaff and a Bernina. Thank you for understanding the change of program.

Beverly's background – She was born and raised in California and has lived throughout that state. North Carolina was her home from 1992 to 2019 and she continues to be an active member joining our sewing days and meetings while currently living in Wichita Kansas. She has been sewing

since she was five and quilting for many years. Beverly began to teach quilting in 1981 and considers herself a generalist and enjoys teaching beginning skills. Beverly's specialty is machine work: piecing, quilting and applique. While she prefers machine to hand work, she will often use a combination of both. Quilted clothing is another area of expertise, not only teaching it for many years but also having a business designing and producing limited edition clothing that was sold in five states. She has a history in traditional quilt making but her current interest is toward more contemporary use of fabric and patterns. Using a design wall she will cut and arrange fabric, often letting the fabric suggest the design. Beverly has chaired several quilt shows and has given numerous lectures and workshops in California, North Carolina, and Oregon. Beverly has also taught quilting in three community colleges thru adult education. One of Beverly's favorite jobs was that of a Bernina technician.

Beverly's lecture will be on cleaning and maintaining your machine with a little information on how it behaves and why. She will demonstrate on a Pfaff which has a horizontal bobbin and a Bernina which has a vertical bobbin. Questions will be taken at the end.
