We did not have enough interest in the Applique Workshop and had to cancel it, so, Barbara decided not to make the trip and instead do her presentation over Zoom. The meeting this month will be in the church Parlor instead of the Fellowship Hall. The church will be setting up chairs in the Parlor which is on the opposite side of the church. We will have the west door open, or you can come in the regular door and follow the hallway to the left and left again to the large room on the right.

Don't forget the President's challenge this month. Here are the rules again:

- 1. A 15 in. x 15 in. block or mini quilt.
- 2. Use at least one "flower" designed fabric, your choice of big or small print.
- 3. Use at least 4 different fabrics, all spring colors.
- 4. Your choice of backing.
- 5. Assemble, quilt, and bind.

We will vote on the best projects and award prizes at the May 4th meeting. If you will be joining us by Zoom, we will make time for all to view entries that are in the room and those on Zoom. For those on Zoom, have a piece of paper and pencil ready to add an entry number to your project. Those at home will need to focus your camera on your project during the voting process so you will want to decide the best way to do that. I am looking forward to seeing all the spring projects and I have some great prizes for the winners.

Barbara's Bio: I have always sewn, but it was an antique quilt that I received as a teenager that inspired me to learn to quilt. I began quilting in 1973 (WOW, it seems like yesterday) and appliquéing since 1990 when my New Year's resolution was to "love and conquer the dreaded 'A' word." I have been the President of local guilds in Missouri, Texas, and California. I organized and ran a charity group in Riverside, CA for (7) years that produced "Snuggle Quilts" for at-risk children. We donated up to 200 quilts a year to the local Police Department. I have taught and lectured for over 15 years.



I challenge myself to complete (3) queen size appliqué tops per year and have succeeded for many years. In 2015 I formed the ACADEMY OF APPLIQUE – a week-long appliqué retreat/school held annually at Kingsmill Resort in Williamsburg, VA offering (2) three-day sessions of 10 teachers each from around the world, to about 250 students. Additionally, I have an online quilt store called HUZZAH QUILT SHOPPE, and a new venture called "An Applique Getaway." This event is held annually "floating" around the Midwest for a boutique group of (30) students.



Arts Across Guilford Reception



ANTHONY HAMILTON

Anthony Hamilton has sold over 50 million albums worldwide to date, took home a 2009 Grammy Award in the category of "Best Traditional R&B Performance," and he delivered a momentous concert for President Barack Obama and First Lady Michelle, living up to the title of "the narrator of love" in historic fashion.

In addition to nine classic albums and smashes such as "Charlene," he remains the rare talent who can collaborate with everyone from AI Green, Buddy Guy, and Santana to Rick Ross, DJ Khaled, and Mark Ronson. His voice can also be heard on "Freedom" from the Academy Award-nominated blockbuster Django Unchained by Quentin Tarantino. An accomplished actor, he made his film debut in the critically acclaimed American Gangster and recently starred as Kyle Kirby in the BET+ feature Carl Weber's Influence. He was featured in the NPR documentary series Noteworthy. He also self-published Cornbread, Fish' n Collared Greens, which details the stories behind some of his most recognizable tunes and explores another passion: southern food.

Appalachian Women's Museum Airing of the Quilts

Quilting can be lonely work. A new quilt means hours and hours spent alone measuring, cutting, sewing, pinning, quilting and binding. By the time one is done with a quilt, it feels good to show others that accomplishment.

At the same time, there are older quilts in closets and cedar chests in most families that need to come out into the air.

If they could talk, they would tell of decades of cold nights and warm bodies, of wrapping up babies and comforting the elderly. A quilt might tell of the loving hands that created it and even the individual pieces – the tan from a loved one's shirt or stripes from an old tie – can tell stories of years past.

The Appalachian Women's Museum invites quilters and quilt collectors a chance to show off on Saturday, May 6, from 11 a.m. until 3 p.m. at the annual "Airing of the Quilts." Registration to show a quilt is open now at <u>www.appwomen.org/quilts</u>, with an April 15 deadline.

The airing of the quilts is a traditional rite of spring in the mountains. After a long winter with families snuggled under layers of warm handmade quilts, the warmer weather of springtime gave women a chance to freshen up and air-out these essential covers.

To honor this tradition, the AWM held its first event in 2018 with more than 65 quilts hanging on the wraparound porch, from clotheslines in the yard and on quilt racks and other surfaces throughout the first floor of the museum.

There will also be a fabric scrap exchange, a quilt pattern and book exchange, raffle and music.

Unlike previous events, organizers are allowing repeats for those who have something so special they want to air it again.

Day-of, quilts must be delivered to the AWM between 8 and 10 a.m. on Saturday, May 6; or call the museum at 828-482-5860 to make arrangements. Pickup after event May 6 is between 3 and 3:45 p.m. Quilts must be picked up the day of the Airing.

Friendship Album Quilt

Visitors will also have an opportunity to purchase a square on a Friendship Album Quilt with their name or honoring someone in their lives. After all the squares are sold, the quilt will be hung in the entryway of the house.




