For this 10" block you need to click outside the pop-up window that first appears and it will disappear, revealing this cutie.

If you're looking for a table runner, try out The Sewing Loft's Triple Scoop Sundae at thesewingloftblock.com/triplle-scoop-quilt-clock. For this one, you need to add it to your cart and check out, giving your address and email. During forty years of quilting, Carol has become interested in making small quilted projects as well as quilts. As a retired physician, she enjoys bringing her technical mind to quilting. She likes to find ways to make the construction process easier while producing better results.

She has also refined techniques for building, organizing, and using a stash that make it a joy to have and to use. She loves to use bright colors. In addition to quilts, she makes many small quilted items.

Carol has been teaching quilting classes for about ten years. She loves sharing her tips and tricks with others and encouraging students as they try new projects and techniques. One of her favorite aspects of teaching is seeing students succeed at completing a challenging project. Another is seeing students have "Aha!" moments during which they see how simple changes in technique can help them create projects that look better while taking less effort.

Some quilters find that their fabric stash, scraps, quilting tools, and books have become a burden, as they don't have a good approach for organization and storage of these precious resources. Knowing how to approach the task of organizing quilting supplies makes it easy to transform the dreaded stash into a collection that is a delight to use. This lecture provides many practical ideas for making your fabric, tools, thread, books, and magazines readily accessible. Topics include how to fold and store fabric so that it's easy to view and locate, labeling, using your computer as a tool, and many ideas for actually using your stash.

SASHIKO Sewing Machine by Baby Lock




Used SASHIKO (Model BLQK) sewing machine for sale for \$500. This machine is different any other conventional sewing machine. The Sashiko will make one stitch on the top of the fabric after the handwheel makes two complete rotations when the needle is in the down position. When the needle is in the up position it will make one stitch after the handwheel makes one and a half rotations. The specialty needle will catch and release the bobbin thread alternately. Stitching on the top looks like hand quilting. The stitching will not

unravel, so it is not necessary to make tacking stitch. Adjustable stitching and spacing.

Baby Lock Sashiko Model BLQK2 retails for \$5,398.00. I purchased this machine used and am selling it for less than I paid. The machine is in good condition and works well. If you want the hand quilted look on your quilts without the handwork, this machine is for you.

This is a specialty machine and is not for normal sewing. Instruction books, needles, and other supplies are included. See photos for stitching samples.
