Kelsey and Nicole became co-owners of Village Fabric Shop in late February 2021. They follow in the footsteps of 4 other Winston Salem crafters, sewists, and quilters who who had craft and fabric shops in the Reynolda Village since 2009.


They met as Textile Instructors at <u>Sawtooth</u> <u>School for Visual Art</u> and dreamed up a community space and textile shop while picking, carding, and spinning sheep and alpaca fleeces in the Appalachian mountains - little did they know that dream would become a reality just 6 months later.

Nicole moved to Winston-Salem after receiving her Master's in Art and Design from North Carolina State University in 2018. She is a textile artist and educator with over 10 years of teaching experience. She teaches classes in art and design fundamentals, textile design, weaving, natural dye practices, and leather working. In her artwork she is focused on eco-based techniques and using traditional textile practices to tell unconventional stories. Nicole loves helping people find their fiber passions. Check in with her if you need help selecting a color palette for next project.

Kelsey moved to Winston-Salem in late 2015 to work as a Coordinator and Art Teacher with Arts For Life, a non-profit that supports pediatric patients and families through arts education and engagement at Brenner Children's Hospital. She's seen the joy that creating brings to people and loves to spread the joy. She has been teaching weaving, natural dying, sewing, and fiber processing for over 9 years. Kelsey loves being scrappy with her materials, and mixing up traditional processes with new and modern ones. She's been sewing for as long as she can remember and as a lover of everything hand-made she has a experience with most textiles' crafts. She volunteers with the Boys and Girls Club Garden in WS growing natural dye and fiber plants, and teaching youth how to dye with the plants they grow.

SASHIKO Sewing Machine by Baby Lock



Used SASHIKO (Model BLQK) sewing machine for sale for \$500. This machine is different than any other conventional sewing machine. The Sashiko will make one stitch on the top of the fabric after the handwheel makes two complete rotations when the needle is in the down position. When the needle is in the up position it will make one stitch after the handwheel makes one and a half rotations. The specialty needle will catch and release the bobbin thread alternately. Stitching on the top looks like hand quilting. The stitching will not

unravel, so it is not necessary to make tacking stitch. Adjustable stitching and spacing.

Baby Lock Sashiko Model BLQK2 retails for \$5,398.00. I purchased this machine used and am selling it for less than I paid. The machine is in good condition and works well. If you want the hand quilted look on your quilts without the handwork, this machine is for you.

This is a specialty machine and is not for normal sewing. Instruction books, needles, and other supplies are included. See photos for stitching samples.






