- ✓ Our 2024 Quilt show success. 456 Visitors over the 2-day show along with the most money ever raised for Silent Auction, Yard Sale, Raffle Baskets and Boutique in our Guild History!
- ✓ A big thank you to those who donated items both members and non-members who contributed throughout the year
- ✓ The largest Charitable Donation we have ever made from our Silent Auction, \$3,900 awarded to the Combat Female Veterans Families United.
- ✓ \$1,300 raised for the Asheville Guild Guild for hurricane recovery efforts
- ✓ Donated fabric scraps for dog beds for the animal shelter
- ✓ Donating 107 Quilts to Cone Hospital for 2024!
